The financial agreement between EHL and the Haute Ecole Spécialisée de Suisse occidentale (HES-SO) states that the HES-SO will cover part of the tuition fees of eligible students. According to this agreement, academic tuition invoiced to these students is limited to CHF 1'000 per academic year, the remainder being paid by the HES-SO. This measure is effective from the first year of the Bachelor program. It does not apply to the Preparatory Year, which is not covered by this agreement.

Eligibility for a subsidy:

Aside from Swiss students whose parents live in Switzerland, other students may be eligible for an A-HES subsidy should they meet one of the below conditions at time of immatriculation:

- Students with Swiss nationality who live abroad or whose parents live abroad
- Refugees and stateless persons of age assigned to a canton in Switzerland
- Foreign students of age whose civil residence is located in Switzerland (excluding B permit for education purposes)
- Foreign students who have lived permanently for at least two years in the same canton in Switzerland, where they have had a full-time paid employment giving them financial independence without undertaking a training course at the same time
- Foreign students whose parents' or legal guardians' civil residence is located in Switzerland
- Foreign students whose parents live abroad and who have at least one parent working in the canton of Geneva and holding a G permit

The questionnaire determining the granting of an A-HES subsidy will be sent to students one month before the start of the academic year BOSC. The HES-SO is the intermediary, but it is ultimately the concerned Canton that determines whether or not it will cover the mentioned part of the tuition fees, according to the conditions set out in the Intercantonal agreement on universities of Applied Sciences (A-HES). The status defined at the beginning of the studies remains unchanged for the whole duration of studies at EHL. Should a student abandon his or her studies or lose A-HES status for any other reason before 15 October or 15 April, depending on the half-year in progress, he/she will lose his/her funding and the HES-SO will stop contributing to tuition fees. In this case, the full amount of tuition and fees for international students will be applicable and invoiced.

Details

COMPULSORY FEES

The compulsory fees payable by the student consist of the tuition fees, a lump sum for infrastructure and services, as well as a prepayment for restaurants and bars (independently whether the student lives on the campus or not); they apply to the relevant academic intake.

TUITION FEES INCLUDE

Academic courses, finals exam fees, guest lectures, including field trips and workshop in different locations, support for internships and access to industry partners for student business projects (SBP), thesis and language courses.

INFRASTRUCTURES & SERVICES INCLUDE

The infrastructures and services fees package first and mainly covers:

- Organization and logistics costs on campus
- Participation in management
- Operating costs of multiple departments such as marketing, communications, admissions and alumni
- Costs of administrative functions such as human resources, finance, purchasing and IT
- Depreciation

In addition, costs of a full range of additional individual services for which students have access are covered, such as:

Sports facilities and sports activity training, Student Affairs Services (academic support and coaching), Health and Well-being services (psychological support, sport and health center), Internships and Career Services, Internship and career planning & monitoring, career fairs, Access to Digital Centre and professional print-shop services, Swiss insurances (if applicable): accident, public liability, theft, computer equipment insurance covering theft and damage, according to the applicable terms and conditions, Extracurricular student activities, Professional uniforms for practical classes (for AP only), Equipment for practical and theory classes, Alumni lifelong membership (for BOSCO only).

PREPAID FOOD & BEVERAGE CREDIT

At the beginning of each academic year, student cards are charged with a mandatory minimum amount to cover meals and beverages taken in the outlets on campus. The prepaid amount must be used before the end of the academic year and is non-refundable. Any remaining amount at the end of the academic year is transferred to EHL's Scholarship Foundation. Students can recharge their card at any time. The recharged amount can be refunded at the end of their studies if not used.

Terms & Conditions of Payment

DOWN PAYMENT

After confirmation of admission to EHL, students are required to pay a down payment on tuition fees of CHF 6'000 within 15 days in order to guarantee their place. This amount is non-refundable under any circumstances. This down payment amount is then deducted from the total amount due.

Important note: In addition to the down payment of CHF 6'000, Swiss authorities require students from outside the EU/EFTA to make an initial payment of CHF 18'000 before submitting a visa application. This amount will be deducted from the total amount due.

INVOICING

The total amount of the compulsory fees is invoiced before the beginning of each academic year and payment is due within 30 days of reception. EHL reserves the right to charge, upon expiry of the 30-day payment period, reminder expenses and interests on overdue payments. In addition, the following measures can be taken: block the student card, forbid the student to attend the exams or to start the intake or finally ex-matriculate the student.

In case of a withdrawal less than 10 working days before the start of the academic year or if students do not take up their place at the start of term or complete the academic year, students are charged the totality of compulsory fees as a lump sum (in accordance with Art. 160 & ff, Swiss Code of Obligations). This clause shall apply regardless of attributable fault, particularly in the event of sickness, accident, withdrawal, definitive academic failure, disciplinary suspension or expulsion or for any other reason.

Should a student suspend or repeat an academic year or a semester, the latest official fees apply. An invoice shall be issued for the semester or year to be joined or repeated, with the fee of the new session he joins.

DEPOSIT OF GUARANTEE (REIMBURSED AT THE END OF STUDIES)

A deposit of CHF 5'000 is required from all new students. This deposit covers any exceptional costs which may arise, for example from damage to rooms or materials. The deposit or the remainder will be reimbursed at the end of the student's studies at EHL. Interest earned on the deposit will accrue and be added to EHL's scholarship Foundation, as part of the institution's social responsibility policy for the education of students with financial difficulties.

These prices are defined based on the inflation rate forecasted by the Swiss National Bank (BNS). If there is a strong variation, EHL will make adjustments accordingly. For further information please consult our website: www.ehl.edu

HEALTH INSURANCE

Basic health and accident insurance is mandatory by law in Switzerland. Students whose fiscal residence – or whose parents' fiscal residence – is outside Switzerland are automatically enrolled in EHL's health and accident insurance plan. An exemption may be obtained by providing proof of adequate coverage to the Swiss authorities. (e.g. European health insurance card). The annual premium of CHF 1'620 is subject to change.

SWISS RESIDENCE TAX & VISA EXPENSES

Administrative taxes are collected by the Swiss authorities for residence permits and visas. The fees may vary depending on the nationality of the student. A tourist tax of CHF 37.- per month will be invoiced to students whose legal address is not in Switzerland (legal obligation). It will be charged by the school for students who are living on campus and by the city of Lausanne for students who are not living on campus.

ON-CAMPUS ACCOMMODATION & PARKING

- Students in the preparatory year are encouraged to live on campus. For these students, double rooms in the residences are offered on a priority basis at a rate of CHF 5,850 per semester. This rate includes all heating, electricity and Wi-Fi charges. It also includes all the services of complete cleaning of the room once a week with replacement of bed and bath linen, as well as a technical intervention service for any problem linked to the infrastructures.
- Security is available 24 hours a day on campus and the rooms have direct access to the sports facilities and common areas.
- For Bachelor students (Boscs 1 to 6) two types of accommodation are available: Single rooms are available at a rate of CHF 7'800 per semester in the residences. The rate includes the same charges and services as the double rooms.
- The NeighborWood area, which is just a short walk from the campus, offers studios or flats for rent. The rates vary according to the category booked range from CHF 7,087 per semester for a studio to CHF 4,237 per semester for a room in a 4-bedroom flat.
- Indoor and outdoor parking spaces are available on campus for a rate of CHF 1,500 and CHF 990 per semester, respectively.

ADDITIONAL EXPENSES

- Other expenses such as textbooks and application fees are not included. Plan on an approximate budget of CHF 150 per semester for study materials. A fee of CHF 175 is due upon the submission of an application. If students need to retake examinations, the fee is CHF 300 per retake.
- All students are required to register at HES-SO (CHF 150).
- Living expenses depend upon personal needs and the lifestyle of the individual student.
